	<ol> <li>Each student will receive a strip of sticker paper.</li> <li>They will dip their thumbs in the provided colour paints and gently press them onto the sticker strip to create thumbprint patterns.</li> </ol>	
	3. These thumb impressions will represent their personal "green promise" to care for the Earth.	
	4. Once complete, teachers will assist students in wrapping the sticker strip around their wrist like a wristband.

Natural Dyes Provided by School: Turmeric (Yellow) Beetroot (Pink/Red) Spinach/Coriander (Green) Tea/Coffee (Brown) (All dyes will be safely prepared and handled by teachers or staff.)  3. Techniques to Explore: Tie and Dye using rubber bands to create patterns Stamping using leaves, okra, or other vegetables  4. Activity Process: Teachers will guide students to gently dip or stamp their cloth using natural dyes. Cloth pieces will be set aside to air dry during the day.  5. Take-Home Keepsake: Each student will take home their eco-dyed handkerchief — a beautiful reminder of creativity and conscious living.

## ☐ Instructions for Participants:

# 1. Create a science model or project using scrap or recycled materials only. Examples include:

- o Old cardboard, plastic bottles, straws, wires
- o Bottle caps, used CDs, foil, newspapers, boxes, etc.

# 2. **Assembly must be done at school** during the competition. (*Pre-made or pre-assembled projects will not be accepted.*)

- 3. **Time Limit:** 1 hour *(or as decided by the teachers)*
- 4. Each participant must bring:
  - All required scrap/recycled materials
  - o Scissors, glue, tape, markers, and any other basic stationery
  - o A base board (if needed) for display
- 5. Suggested Topics:
  - o Rainwater Harvesting
  - Simple Machines
  - Solar Energy
  - o Windmill/Turbine
  - Pollution Control
  - Human Body Systems
  - o Any topic representing a science concept
- 6. Projects must:
  - o Clearly represent a science principle or system
  - o Be made entirely from scrap
  - o Be **explained briefly** by the student during evaluation
- 7. **Label your project** with:
  - o Your name
  - Class, Section
  - Project title
